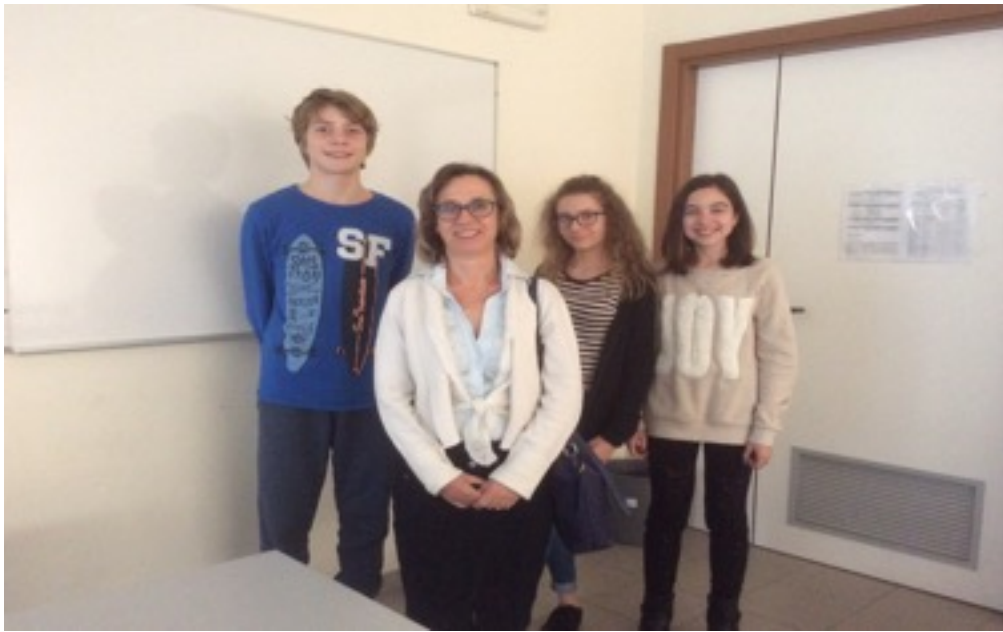

A recipe: GINGERBREAD MAN



The Gingerbread Man comes from a fairy tale loved by all children in Germany, British Isles, Eastern Europe and USA.

Preparation time: 30 – 50 minutes

INGREDIENTS for 20 pieces:

350g plain flour

1 teaspoon bicarbonate of soda

2 teaspoons ground ginger

1 teaspoon ground cinnamon

125g butter

175g brown sugar

1 free-range egg

4 tablespoons golden syrup
cake decorations

METHOD:

1. Mix together the flour, bicarbonate of soda, ginger and cinnamon in a bowl and add the butter and blend in a food processor until the mix looks like breadcrumbs. Stir in the sugar.
2. Lightly beat the egg and golden syrup together, add to the food processor and pulse until the mixture clumps together. Tip the dough out, knead briefly until smooth and put in the fridge for 15 minutes.
3. Preheat the oven to 180C. Line two baking trays with greaseproof paper.
4. Roll the dough out to a 0.5cm in thickness on a lightly floured surface. Cut out the gingerbread men shapes and place on the baking tray.
5. Bake for 12-15 minutes, until lightly golden-brown. Leave on the tray for 10 minutes. When cooled decorate with the cake decorations.
